IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT CLASSES

Specify Open/AA(Adult Amateur)/JrYR (Junior Young Rider) on entry form – AA and JrYR Training Level Classes will be held concurrently with open classes, but will be pinned as separate divisions, if number of entries in each division exceeds six. All other classes (First – FEI) will be pinned as a single class. **You must state the division in which you will compete on the entry form, or your entry will be classified as OPEN.** Amateurs must include a copy of their USEF membership card proving Amateur status. A competitor is a Junior Young Rider until the end of the calendar year in which he or she reaches age 21.

* **Novice Rider / Horse** classes are for riders who have not competed above training level and are not a professional (someone who receives remuneration for having or sharing the responsibility for instruction, teaching, schooling or advising a rider on the training of a horse at any time prior to or during the competition.) Please specify horse and rider on entry form.

† Specify Level and Open or Qualifying on entry form. Freestyle riders are responsible for their music. Music must be given to the secretary a minimum of 1 hour prior to the class. Be sure to mark your name, number and class time on the tape. Include copy of qualifying test score with entry.

†† Specify Open and/or Qualifying on entry form. For GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes, rider and owner must be a USEF member (Jr, Senior or Life); horse must be life time registered/recorded with USDF & USEF, rider must be a USDF participating member & owner must be a USDF participating or business member. If GAIG/USDF Qualifying entry, pay class fee + \$10.00. GAIG/USDF Qualifying rides will not be pinned separately.

For Dover AA Medal Class32: Specify Dover AA Medal on entry form. Rider must provide copy of USEF Adult Amateur membership status, and copy of USDF GMO or Participating Membership. Medal will be awarded to adult amateur rider with highest score of the class, earning a minimum 60%.



ENTRIES – A separate entry form is required for Paduka Run Show I and Paduka Run Show II

ENTRIES:

- USEF/USDF recognized Entry Form ONLY – a separate entry form and all required fees are required for each day you plan to compete.
- Refunds will be given for cancellations received in writing before the closing date less a \$20.00 office fee. If for any reason a class(es) or an entire day(s) needs to be cancelled due to an act of God, national tragedy, or any other reason, no refunds will be made. No refund after Closing Date for any reason.

USEF Fees and Requirements

- USEF membership information for EACH rider, owner, trainer (and coach if applicable) is required on your entry form. Please send copies of USEF membership cards for EACH rider, owner, trainer (and coach if applicable).
- For non-members of USEF: A \$30.00 non member fee for EACH rider, owner, trainer (and coach if applicable) per entry form.
- **Riders in GAIG/USDF qualifying classes must include a copy of their USEF Horse Recording Certificate.**
- The USEF Horse ID or Horse Recording number is required on your entry form. If you do not have a Horse ID or Horse Recording number, you may apply for one before the competition, or provide your USDF Horse ID/Registration number as proof for Horse ID.

USDF Fees and Requirements

- The USDF membership information for EACH rider and owner/lessee is required on your entry form. Please send copies of your USDF membership or non-membership cards. If you do not have a USDF membership or non-member card, you will be required (for rider and owner/lessee) to fill out either a Non-member ID (NID) or a USDF member Affidavit and pay an additional \$5.00 fee before you are allowed to compete. USDF Non-members must also pay the \$20 USDF non-member fee per entry per day.
- The USDF Horse ID or Horse Registration is required on your entry form. Please send copies of your USDF Horse Registration or ID card. If you do not have a Horse ID or Registration number, you will be required to fill out either a Horse ID (\$20 fee) or Lifetime Horse Registration (\$85 fee). If you have a Horse ID or Registration number but cannot provide proof, you will be required to fill out a USDF Affidavit and pay an additional \$5.00 fee before you are allowed to compete. USDF Horse lifetime registrations are required for GAIG/USDF Qualifying classes.

FOOTING AND ARENAS

Sand competition arenas—each 60 meters long and 20 meters wide. Warm-up on sand and turf.

VETERINARIAN AND FARRIER

A licensed veterinarian will be on-call during competition. A farrier will be on-grounds during competition. Contact information will be listed at secretary's stand and in the stabling area.

AWARDS

Up to six (6) ribbons for each class.

Awards for show champions to be announced on website prior to show.

Breed ribbons and awards available from participating breed registries.

The Dover Adult Amateur Medal will be awarded to the highest scoring USEF Adult Amateur from class 32 (60% minimum score req'd). Rider must provide copy of USEF Adult Amateur membership status, and copy of USDF GMO or Participating Membership.

Note: USEF registered Adult Amateurs may use any "open" class scores for year end awards.

Awards will be distributed at the Awards booth in the big tent, except for ribbons presented during Award Ceremonies. All ribbons and prizes for each award will be given to the one person picking up and signing for them and who accepts responsibility for further distribution.

Tests and awards not picked up during the show will not be mailed to competitor but will be donated to WNYDA Banquet for door prizes. If you are not available, have a friend pick them up.

STABLING

Permanent box stalls with stall doors at an adjacent farm (within walking distance of show grounds); **Sporhorse/Breed competitors:** arrive Thurs after 2 pm to Friday 2 pm \$50.00 per stall. Paduka Run I and II under saddle (non breed show): Horses may arrive on the grounds after 2 pm Friday and stay until 7:00pm Sunday. \$100.00 per stall for the weekend (Fri & Sat nights). 3 night stay \$150.00 but horse must be entered in Breed show if staying Thurs evening. Shavings may be ordered in advance at \$10.00 per bag with entry form. Tack stalls are \$100.00 for the weekend. One day stabling rates at \$50 per day may be available, but weekend requests will be given preference. A \$25.00 refundable stall cleaning deposit required with entry on separate check for each stall rented payable to WNYDA. This deposit will be refunded if stall is stripped (and inspected) before leaving the grounds. If groups want to be together, please specify this on entry form. You will not be able to load and unload directly in front of your stall. Extra shavings will be available on show grounds for purchase day of event, but unless ordered in advance, delivery cannot be guaranteed. Management reserves the right to add additional temporary stalls if needed.

Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes. If for any reason a class(es) or an entire day(s) needs to be cancelled due to an act of God, national tragedy, or any other reason, no refunds will be made. Only horses entered in the competition are permitted on the grounds due to insurance regulations. All riders *must* wear *PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR* at all times when mounted. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. (see rule GR1301.7)

**USDF BREEDERS CHAMPIONSHIP 2010 NEW ENGLAND SERIES QUALIFIER
AT PADUKA RUN I**

Held Friday morning, July 23, 2010 in outdoor sand arena

Breeding Division – Mature Horse

Run in accordance with USEF breeding horse rules; judged for suitability to produce dressage horses. Horses shall be judged in hand and at the walk and trot on the triangle, and standing for conformation. 50% movement, 40% conformation, 10% general impression, including masculinity (stallion), femininity (mare), development and harmony.

Dressage Sport Horse Prospects Division – Young horse

Run in accordance with USEF rules for Dressage Sport Horses and judged for suitability to become dressage horses. Horses shall be shown in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle and standing for conformation. 60% movement, 30% conformation and 10% general impression (including impulsion, balance and temperament).

WNYDA Grand Championship

To be judged on same terms as Dressage Breeding Division

Triangle Procedure

Classes so designated will perform individually on the triangle as described in the USEF Rulebook DR-209. The triangle measures approximately 30 meters on each side, and 15 meters from B-C. When called by the Ringmaster, present your horse to the Judge at A.

Upon direction, follow the procedure as diagramed:

- Stand horse at A for conformation judging
- Walk small triangle A – B – C – A
- Trot large triangle A – D – E – A
- Leave judging area promptly unless requested otherwise by judge

Handler/Rider Considerations

Secretary must have a complete and signed entry form for each horse/rider combination in the under saddle classes. All handlers must have a signed form with Secretary. Only registered handlers are allowed to handle horses on show grounds. All handlers must wear blue wristband in Warm Up and Competition Arenas. All Assistant Handlers must wear yellow wristband in Warm Up and Competition Arenas. Wristbands indicate complete entry paperwork.

Entry Acceptance Policies

Because “ride” times are scheduled in the same way as the Dressage Show, Secretary shall accept entries on a first come basis and may close classes as necessary due to ring time constraints.

Broodmares Accompanying Foal

Each Broodmare accompanying a foal entered in the Breed Show shall fill out her own Entry Form. Pay Office Fee with Entry. Broodmares are exempt from Drug Fee, non membership fees, and Non Compete Fee so long as she does not further perform in either Breed Show or Dressage Show. Broodmare will be assigned a Bridle Number to be worn at all times. Broodmares must comply with Rules of the Prize list.

Order of Go

“Ride” times will be assigned and will become the posted order of go for each class. Time for Handler conflicts will be allowed for in this order of go. Handlers must inform the warm up steward of impending conflicts. Horses must check in with warm up steward before their time slot. Horses that have not checked in with the warm up steward prior to their posted order of go will be given a three minute call. Horses not ready to show at the end of this three minute call will be eliminated. Horses not complying with these stipulations may be eliminated at discretion of Show Management.

Turnout

Bridles are optional on yearlings or younger, but mandatory on horses two years old and older. Braiding is optional. Foals must be in control of handler and may not be shown loose.

Breed Registration

Full breed registration documentation must be presented with entry. See General Specifications for details, which apply to IBC classes.

IBC Classes

Each IBC class is open to horses of any age providing copy of breed registration with entry. Show Management will determine its eligibility. Incomplete entries will not be accepted. Horses to be shown in hand and to move at the judge’s discretion.

Amateur/Junior/Young Rider Handler

Open to mares, geldings and weanling colts or fillies (no stallions or unweaned foals). Handler to be judged on presentation of the animal in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle and stand for conformation judging. Neatness/appearance of handler; overall condition of the horse will be considered. Conformation of horse not the determining factor, but may count 15%. Handler must be USEF Amateur or USDF Junior with indication on copy of USEF card. Handler must be owner or member of the owner's family, no leased or borrowed horses. Intended to stimulate participation of Amateurs and Juniors in the breeding division.

USDF Materiale Classes

Materiale classes will be run according to USEF Dressage Division Rules (ISEF DR 133 and DR 204.2e). Dress must conform to USEF DR 120. Entries are not required to show in any in-hand, group or under saddle class. Class will be judged by the USDF Materiale Score Sheet and run according to the USDF "Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes" which is posted on the USDF website: www.usdf.org. Classes for fillies and mares will not be combined with classes for colts, geldings or stallions. Four and five year old horses may be asked to lengthen stride at trot and canter. Classes for fillies and mares may be combined, with only mares asked to lengthen stride. Three year old colts/gelding may be combined with four and five year old stallions/gelding with only four and five year old horses asked to lengthen. Judged: 90% on movement (30% walk, 30% trot, 30% canter) and 10% on General Impression. Riders may ride one horse only in each class.

Breed Documentation

Horses are not required to be registered, except for entrance to IBC classes and for eligibility in Breed Specific High Score Special Awards. Primary Registration in the Breed Registry which issued foal papers and/or UELN (Universal Equine Life Numbers) for the horse/foal, or a COP /Birth Certificate. Provide documentation for registered horses. And, it is strongly recommended that unregistered horses be indicated and all available pedigree information provided.

Show management will acknowledge in program only one Breed, even if multiple breeds are indicated on Entry Form. Indicate Primary Registration on Entry Form but send documentation for Secondary Registration(s) as well.

Requirements for IBC Classes and Breed Specific High Score Special Awards

All entrants who wish to enter IBC Class(es) and/or be eligible for Breed Specific High Score Special Awards must supply non returnable complete breed documentation with entry. Copy of one of the follow will suffice: registration; passport cover or pedigree page containing horse name, breed and registration number, certificate of ownership indicating horse name, breed and registration number.

Awarding Breed Specific High Score Special Awards

Breed Specific High Score Special Awards are awarded for both Breed Show and Dressage Show and vary from year to year. Eligibility lists will be set one week after Closing Date, using only entries complete as of that date and classes which have been entered. No horses will be added to the lists after that point. Post entries and entries made complete after that point will not be added to the eligibility lists.
